have had and with the amendments I think we will be able to better define the yeses and the noes as far as campaign contribution uses and I think it is a good amendment, I certainly support it.

SENATOR LAMB: I rise to support the amendment, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, I call the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I think we will let the discussion go a little bit longer. Senator Cope.

SENATOR COPE: Mr. President, members, I support the amendment. It is nice to have it in writing what one can do for a change along with what we can't do and give it the support.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: A question of, I suppose, Senator Beutler, an attorney. Will this fifty dollar donation to any one charity in one year, this would not exclude closing the campaign funds and giving a larger amount to some organization like American Legion or somebody like that, would it?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No. No, when you close out your fund you can give the money. That is one of the alternatives for giving away your money.

SENATOR MARESH: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Stoney, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. Speaker, I would like to know what the decision is going to be subsequently on an individual in this body calling the question and whoever is seated in the Chair summarily saying, no, I think we will just continue the debate. I question whether or not we have the authority to do that. Could we please check the rules and see if an individual requests a closing of debate, if that has to be abided with or if the Chair has the authority to override that?

SPEAKER MARVEL: I will read, let's see, Rule 7, Section 4 and it says, "the previous question shall be in this form, shall the debate now close? The previous question shall be made only in the normal course of speaking order and shall be in order when demanded by five or more members and must be sustained by a vote of the majority of the elected
