There are still a few. You look at appointments that come to you for consideration. There are some people that tell you very privately that they think that that is not very reasonable. They should not have to do this but they have two choices. When they are appointed they can deny it or they can accept it knowing there are some accountable procedures which they have to answer to or they can just say, I refuse to go through that kind of paperwork and I'm sorry. If you are running for public office it is not unreasonable that you have to show some disclosure to the public and I don't care if it is school board or city or county or whoever it might be. These people could have conflicts and they should be a matter of public record. I see nothing unreasonable about the present law. What irritates me this morning, we have been through this so many times. We look at the crush of bills we have to deal with and here we are spending now three hours one more time on an issue which this body has determined in previous years to be rather significant and I don't think we can turn our backs to it. It has not proven to be damaging to any individual. Sure there is some paperwork but that is not impossible to attain and fill out and disclose. So I am rather irritated this morning by what we are doing here in terms of wasting time I think on something that does not deserve that much time. It is a matter of record and should remain there and the bill should remain intact. It should be advanced. We ought to get on to other bills that have equal importance so that we may leave here June 1 knowing we have tried our best to serve public purpose.
