to work with the public, but as I have pointed out, I think if it had been myself where if I were to organize such a committee and accept contributions and spend funds without accounting for their source or their disposition, I am sure I would be severely criticized by you, my colleagues, by the media, by the public and justifiably so. But if it is sauce for the goose it is sauce for the gander, and I think we ought to all abide by the same rules. There should be no exemptions, no exemptions. Therefore, I ask that you vote for the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, do you wish to speak to the Schmit amendment?

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, I do. I want to correct Senator Schmit's remarks there. It is really called plugging the dam, and that's Hans Cristian Andersen's story about the little Dutch boy. But I am sincere in supporting this amendment and I agree with him, that if you are going to get involved in political issues in terms of soliciting of money and subscribing and giving to certain people a certain kind of information that do not repeat or are not accurate, that I believe it is time that they have to report like anyone else would on the issue of state or whether it is even federal, and not that I am trying to take it out on one individual, I think there will be others as Senator Schmit alluded to who will be doing the same thing because right now they are outside of the accountability law. I think it is appropriate that since we are on accountability that we make certain that all individuals, whatever their mission might be, when they are soliciting funds and they are also putting into the newspapers, I think, figures which are inaccurate when he talks about billions of dollars it's going to cost you, so many thousands of dollars a person, that is misleading and not accurate at all. So, therefore, I support Senator Schmit and I would hope the rest of the body would too.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I came in late. Where is this amendment printed? Is this amendment in the Journal? Well, then I would have to ask Senator Schmit a couple of questions if he would yield, please. Senator Schmit, exactly who comes under... how do we define who comes under this amendment?
