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whole body, the attorney, who could cover such a thing up. It's a blanket privilege that I don't know how you get around. I guess it gets back to trusting the individuals in here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you...thank you, Senator DeCamp. I have mixed emotions about Senator Schmit's amendment. If it were in another context, I could probably deal more objectively with it, but I know that on this bill which by its very existence seems to put a question mark over the integrity of everybody who would run for office and receive money for that purpose, maybe the lawyers should be thrown into the pot and have to scramble in the same way that everybody else does, but where I do have the mixed emotions, Senator Schmit, is because the privilege goes to the client and not to the lawyer. The only reason I am saying these things into the record is so that I would have the opportunity at the same time to indicate that by and large lawyers as a group are not people worthy of more respect or trust than any other group. They are put in a position where they might be tempted more often than most others to do wrong other than business men whom Jonathan Winters in his Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad, Mad World said that even business men who lie, cheat and steal pay income taxes.

SENATOR NICHOL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it is the kind of issue that I think ought to be discussed in a context other than this bill. However, if there are members who think that lawyers are doing perhaps some shady things under the guise of protecting the lawyer-client relationship, maybe the amendment ought to be added and a court should review it, but because of my uncertainty on it, I will not be able to vote for the amendment at this time.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Vickers, you are up next, however, we have an amendment to the amendment so we will take that up ahead if you don't mind. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell moves to amend the Schmit amendment to strike "also"...does that mean strike the word "also", Senator? Senator Newell.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Newell, are you in the vicinity? Would you visit with the Clerk here about what you have written?

CLERK: Are you striking the word "also" attorney, Senator?
