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profession. Now what's happening is probably in a little way the sunshinism that Senator DeCamp was talking about. We are going to ridiculous lengths. If you are going to be equitable, you would include business people, but I don't recommend you doing that. The rule is fine the way it is. Senator Schmit's amendment is a bad amendment. Senator Newell's amendment doesn't make it any better, and I would think that everyone would be tired of nit picking this bill by now, especially with these types of amendments. If those people are truly interested and concerned in these new subjects, let them introduce a bill next year and let's explore the implications of these amendments. Each one of these small amendments has broad implications, believe me, and you are going to hear about Senator Schmit's first amendment before this bill goes much further also already. So I just ask you to reject the Newell amendment, reject the Schmit amendment and let's get on with the bill. Thank you.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Schmit, did you wish to speak to the Newell amendment?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, I do, Mr. President. As I indicated to Senator Newell without looking at the amendment I think I can support it. I want to speak somewhat to the remarks that were made by Senator Beutler. Senator Beutler refers to the fact that we don't make it apply to business. I challenge that. We do make it apply to business. I can tell you very honestly, for example, if Senator Johnson as an engineer were to receive a fee from a company, he would have to report that money he had received, but if Senator Beutler as an attorney were to receive if his firm were to receive that same fee, he does not need to report it. I think there is a tremendous inequity here. I think that we have indicated time and time again, and if you will read my amendment carefully, I want you to read the last portion of it very carefully. I will read it for you, "but shall be required to disclose the same information as any other candidate is required to disclose under such act". In other words, Senator Beutler, the concern you have about going farther with attorneys than with business men is not true. The only information you need to disclose is the same as must be disclosed by any other individual in any other profession. We talked about whether....Senator Chambers asked if the privilege is that of the lawyer or the client. Obviously, the client has the, you know, has some concern about this, but as I indicated earlier, a client who does business with myself or Senator Johnson, or
