

the names, the addresses and the reasonable value of that time that we ought not to so burden our treasurers and our accounting personnel that they have got to keep names, addresses and time records for thousands and thousands of people or hundreds and hundreds of people, and, therefore, twenty hours to me seemed a much more appropriate screening device than Senator Schmit's four hours. I move my amendment to his amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Beutler, did you wish to speak to the Vard Johnson amendment to the amendment? Senator Wesely, did you want to speak to the amendment to the amendment? Senator DeCamp, how about the amendment to the amendment?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I strongly support the amendment and I strongly support the amendment to the amendment, and this is a very serious amendment, and if you will think about it a minute maybe it is the most logical thing that has been done on the sunshine issue since we began. I will put it in perspective as to what it really amounts to. If I tell Bernice Labeledz, Bernice, I am going to give you \$500 for your campaign, that \$500 can be used then to turn around and hire people to work in offices, to stuff envelopes, to go put out yard signs, to do physical labor, to do whatever, but all money is really is a substitute for labor, a way to get labor. That is what money is, and that's true whether it is in campaigns or in the real world. All money is in the form of exchange between your labor and the alternate after you have given the labor something you can use in exchange. The amendment then says look, we recognize this for the first time officially in campaigning. We are going to say that if you are receiving people working, that is the same as somebody giving you money, and over a certain amount, 20 hours, that that then you should have the name of the person just as if they had given you the \$100 bill. And so I strongly support the amendment and I am going along with the amendment to the amendment of Senator Johnson's because it says basically...no, it doesn't say basically, it says exactly this, we now report a \$100 campaign contribution and we say, John DeCamp gave that to Bernice, now we are saying, John DeCamp gave Bernice \$100 worth of work, and that is what the amendment is. So I do urge you to support this amendment and I do believe after reading it that it is word for word out of the amendment I offered earlier. Am I right? Okay, I am right. So I urge you to support it.
