SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the approval of the Wiitala amendment. Those in favor of the amendment vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Wiitala.

SENATOR WIITALA: Mr. Speaker, I hate to do this but I am going to ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The first item is, shall the House go under Call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please return to your seats, record your presence, and see that unauthorized personnel have left the floor. Senator Newell and Senator Carsten, Mr. Sergeant at Arms, those two. Senator Newell, okay, that's all right, you can sit down now. Okay, everybody is accounted for. Everybody should be in their seats, and the Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 1634 and 1635 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion failed.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler moves to amend the Schmit amendment. (Read the Beutler amendment as found on page 1635 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I am dropping the second half of the amendment which has to do with noncash contributions because I believe that everything contained therein with the exception
