SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Again, Mr. President, on the same line of last time, it's technical corrections to make it coincide with existing law since this was taken out of some other context, so I fully support the amendment and again suggest that Senator Beutler will want to support the amendment ultimately.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the second Beutler amendment. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Beutler amendment to the Schmit amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion now before the House is the Schmit amendment as amended. Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak to the Schmit amendment?
