SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would rise to support the amendment. I haven't gotten into this act all day and I ought to have some reason to have to come to the Legislature today. I really happen to believe this is right, in fact, I had an amendment here to prevent a lobbyist from campaigning or contributing to any campaign, just to remove the appearance of evil. Obviously, there is none but appearance is important, and I don't have any problem with this amendment. I think it has a great deal of merit and I would hope we would adopt it. I did not offer anything because I kind of felt the bill had been beat a'ound enough, but since it is here, I think there is some logic to it and my motivation, by the way, I had legislation many years ago before anybody that I can see that has been speaking on this bill today was in the Legislature that did have such a prohibition, so I am now arising to support a concept that I did not introduce a great many years ago, and I think it is a right approach and I would hope the body would adopt it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.
