and then Senator Warner. And I think since we are going into an all night session, this would be a good time to alert you to the fact that we ought to take up budgeting for the rest of the evening. I am serious. Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Just one question of Senator Dworak. Senator Dworak, on your amendment just a little bit of clarification.

SENATOR DWORAK: Yes, Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Are you...when we adopted that amendment, did it just include selling tickets to the lobbyists for a campaign fund or for your fund, or does it include say selling them chances on a quilt or blanket, or selling them chances for a church festival?

SENATOR DWORAK: I think the wording is political fund raising activities, Senator Labedz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Okay.

SENATOR DWORAK: And if that church would be involved in the political activity, then, yes, I imagine that would be included if that was the purpose of it.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Okay.

SENATOR DWORAK: And while I have the microphone, Senator Labedz, I would like to say that I oppose Senator DeCamp's amendment and in any way it should be amended we should also include subagents.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Then one more thing, now if a group, say a Nebraska coalition for life or pro-life group has a fund raiser and that is a political issue or planned parenthood, that is a political issue, if they have a benefit say to raise funds for their cause and we sell tickets to the lobbyists, would you say that is in violation?

SENATOR DWORAK: Well, Senator Labedz, the way the amendment is written right now I would say that is in violation but I would be amenable to exempting the pro-life movement.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Senator Dworak.
