President, support Senator Maresh's motion, because it was not our intention to filibuster this bill, and I would ask that we be given an additional 15 minutes only to see if we can finish the debate now and I wonder if Senator Maresh might modify his motion to that extent, just an at itional 15 minutes on this bill because I want to make it clear that we were not trying to filibuster it.

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I would abide by that, 15 more minutes.

SENATOR CLARK: What the rule is, you want to overrule the Speaker's orders on this. That's what the contention is regardless of how long it is. I have two more speakers now, Senator Vickers and Senator Kahle. Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. Chairman and members. I rise to oppose Senator Maresh's motion to overrule the Speaker's agenda. I would like to just point out a little bit about what is going on in consent calendar. Several of us get rather irritated at the amount of time that we spend on debating and attempting to amend bills on Final Reading and we wonder why. Well, I will suggest to you that the procedure we are going through today is one of the reasons why. I suggested that to you the other day. I will point out to you that last night I was in here reading bills and I happened to be the only member in this body that was in this...I didn't see anybody else in here. Now maybe you were all in your offices somewhere reading them. I was in here this morning again trying to read them and I...honestly, I can't keep up. If the rest of you can, then my congratulations to you. I cannot do it. But I think LB 192 is an important bill. I think we pass important bills in this body too easily, and if there is anything wrong with debating an issue and sitting down and taking a little bit of time on it, then I would like to know what the matter is. I think we are here to produce quality and not quantity. I don't care if we put out 600 laws a year or not. If we only put out a 100 laws that is fine, but let's make them be good laws, and if there are some questions on a bill, I think we should get those questions resolved. Now I will tell you honestly, there can be 30 members of this body that can overrule the Speaker, that can agree with Senator Maresh, that can move 192 over to Select File, but I can guarantee you that that time is going to be spent debating that bill on Select File or on Final Reading. If you think I am going to sit down, shut up and go ahead and let a bill go across without discussing the merits of it, then I am not going to represent the people that elected me to come down here, and I am not going to do it that way.
