SENATOR CLARK: Is this the amendment that staggers the

terms?

SENATOR KREMER: No, my amendment is up there.

SENATOR CLARK: You haven't brought that one up?

SENATOR KREMER: The...the....

SENATOR CLARK: You haven't brought the staggered amendment

up yet?

SENATOR KREMER: No, sir.

SENATOR CLARK: You are going to do that?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CLARK: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, do you wish to close on

your amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No closing, Mr. Speaker, I would just ask for a vote.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the advancement of LB 326, the Beutler amendment. Okay. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We're voting on the Beutler amendment to LB 326. Okay, the motion is carried and the amendment is...record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the Beutler amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is carried and the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a second Beutler amendment to the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, if you would look at Section 4 of the bill, the amendment simply seeks to delete Section 4 from the bill. We had a long discussion this morning about President Reagan's economic policies and about his policies with regard to government regulation and overlapping bureaucracies, and I think sometimes in the legislation that we pass that's right in front of our eyes, we don't see how we ourselves are encouraging overlapping bureaucracies and it kind of gets
