Maybe they don't agree with all of them but I think that maybe we would all have a lot better accountability law if we went with this amendment and it is a much more workable one and maybe the problems of the past could be resolved and they could function better under this proposal. So, I'm going to ask to withdraw that original one and when we get to this final one I'll offer it, if we ever get there.

SENATOR CLARK: Do you want to withdraw your other amendment so we can get to. . . .

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes. Anything I have got up until this last one I would like to withdraw.

SENATOR CLARK: All right. Do you have another one ahead of him?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, Senator Hoagland had an amendment to the bill, do you want to offer that, Senator?

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Hoagland.

CLERK: I think he wants to withdraw that, Mr. President, isn't that right, Senator? Okay. Mr. President, Senator Vard Johnson had a series of amendments to the bill. Senator Vard Johnson is excused. Mr. President, Senator DeCamp had an amendment on 2074 that I understand he wishes to withdraw. Mr. President, the next amendment I have is signed by Senator DeCamp Request #2435, the motion is to return the bill for that amendment.
