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an inopportune time. It was a tough time for everybody. There is not a bill really to deal with it. I know that they have to deal with it quickly. Well, it seems to me that there is two choices. I mean they could adjust and then come back next session or they are asking the entire State of Nebraska to adjust to meet their particular problem. It is almost Mohammed and the mountain. Mohammed doesn't seem to want to come to the mountain and so the mountain is supposed to come to Mohammed and I am not sure that is really the situation we ought to be placed in. I think it is quite possible that they can make some adjustments and try to meet the law and wait for the normal legislative process through next session to deal with the problem. I think that is the logical solution to the problem. I don't understand why they feel that they have to be the martyr, why they have to be drug off to jail, why they have to do the certain things that they seem to want to do if we don't do some changes this session, and I think, quite frankly, we are all I think falling in disfavor across this state because of these attempts to get bills and deal with issues in a haphazard manner and our image is hurt by it, when in fact those people out in the lobby should be making the adjustments, not us, and I think we can deal with the issue in due time next session, don't need to take more time this session, and we can deal with it in a more rational way on that basis. So I would oppose any further attempts to get this bill and ask your support for that position.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Speaker, I move the previous question.

SENATOR CLARK: The previous question has been asked for. Do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate will vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted on ceasing debate? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Debate has ceased. Senator Koch, do you want to close?
