SPEAKER MARVEL: Shall the House go under Call is the first order of business. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, to go under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats, record your presence. Mr. Sergeant at Arms, please find Senator Wiitala, Senator Kahle and Senator Beutler. Okay, Senator Kahle and Senator Beutler. Okay, the motion before the House is the overruling of the calendar. We are ready for the roll call. You want a roll vote, right?

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, are there four members that are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes. Senator Chambers, Senator Vickers, Senator DeCamp and Senator Schmit.

SENATOR STONEY: Considering the issue, will the majority of those voting prevail in this particular case or does it require a simple majority of 25. I would like to know that before the roll is called.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Stoney, the ruling is that in the absence of any other motion it takes 25 votes to overrule the calendar.

SENATOR STONEY: Now let me...from a definitional standpoint understand. Was this just not a recommendation that you are making to the Legislature, a recommendation that the calendar be altered? Is that it?

SPEAKER MARVEL: I'm sorry, say it over again.

SENATOR STONEY: So that I can understand it, this is a recommendation that you are making to us that we extend the session to June 5th. Is that not correct? So we are not amending your order, are we, the Speaker's order?

SPEAKER MARVEL: You are amending the calendar.

SENATOR STONEY: As recommended by you. Is that correct?

SPEAKER MARVEL: The calendar, yes.

SENATOR STONEY: Alright, and it requires 25 votes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR STONEY: Then the 25 votes, if there are 25 votes, that means we adjourn this Friday, May 29th as has been
