SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I will close and I will close briefly. First of all, if I am presumptuous I will apologize. If I am not, I will probably be very disappointed but that is something we have to see since Senator Ilefner has not made a solid commitment on this issue. I would like to say that I have heard arguments about people playing politics with this issue and I have just talked to Senator Stoney about some of the "motives" and I want to assure him that those are not, that that is not true and that if anybody else has motives from, hears about motives from this side of the issue, the motives are simply and only to preserve the Harrison Street as we did in legislative districts and with that, I would withdraw this amendment and hope that we do not have to offer it again on Final Reading.
