PRESIDENT: Okay, we are ready then for unfinished business.

CLERK: I believe I have got nothing further, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, we are ready to recognize then for the...on unfinished business, the Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I move that the Legislature approve the preparation and printing of the permanent Legislative Journal, Session Laws and Index by Patrick O'Donnell, and that he be directed to send to each member of the Legislature a copy of the loose-leaf session laws and of the permanent Journal and Session Laws.

PRESIDENT: All right, is there any discussion? Senator Dworak, did you wish to discuss that particular...? All right, the question then is the adoption of the Carsten motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the motion.

PRESIDENT: The Carsten motion is adopted. The motion carries and is adopted. The next motion, the Chair recognizes Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: President Luedtke and colleagues, I move that the Journal for the Ninetieth Day as prepared by the Clerk, be approved.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Motion is to approve the Journal, the Dworak motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 mays on adoption of the motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The Dworak motion to accept the Journal and approve the Journal is approved. The next motion is by Senator Kremer. The Chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. President, I move that a committee of six be appointed to advise the Governor that the 87th Legislature, First Session of the Nebraska Legislature is about, hopefully, to complete its work, and return with
