I move that the Eighty-seventh Legislature, First Session, of the Legislature has finished all business before it, now at 6:24 we adjourn sine die. And I hope I get more votes than Mr. Vickers got.

PRESIDENT: All right, all those in favor of adjourning this session of the Legislature, the Eighty-seventh Legislature, First Session, sine die will signify by saying...(all say aye). Do you want a machine vote? Okay, let's go to a machine vote. I know how many... we might want to take 40 votes to stay here, so all those in favor vote aye, and those opposed nay, and we will go to the board. Record the vote. The Chair declares that the Eighty-seventh Session...Eighty-seventh Legislature, First Session, having completed its work and carried out all its business, now at 6:25 p.m. stands in this year with an adjourn sine die.
