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dice brings up a number that I win on, then I should be able to recoup what it costs me to go to court but if I lose, then I lose. I just regret that a decision of this kind could not be limited to the individual who brings the action but it will apply to everybody situated as I am which means every senator in this body. So instead of talking about limiting bills we ought to talk about loosening the restriction on the number of days that we can meet and if we genuinely feel that they're very important matters that cannot be handled within the ninety day period or the sixty day period, whenever these matters fall, we, by a vote of about 40, which seems almost impossible to get, but by a vote of the Legislature can extend any session that we choose. So the means to find the time to handle everything of importance is available right now. So what I hope you will do is reject this attempt to limit the number of bills. Senator Beutler, last year, when he fought for the limit, I think introduced about a thousand. He was the answer in modern times to Terry Carpenter but Terry Carpenter is gone. I'm glad that he is not forgotten but remember this. One person can exercise no more power or sway over another than that other chooses to allow to be exercised over him or her. So we need to strengthen ourselves, discipline ourselves and although I speak all the time against a limitation on bills, it is very seldom that I will introduce the number of bills that will reach my limit but there are other occasions when I probably will go beyond that because my mind is more fertile than at others and I feel that time is more ripe than others to offer some of these ideas. So whereas Senator Peterson and Senator Goll and Senator Kilgarin and others may be spared having to listen to me some sessions because I won't offer many bills, other times they are going to be cursed because it may be necessary for me to offer a hundred bills...(interruption.)

SENATOR CLARK: You have one minute left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and should that necessity arise, since I am not employed by the members of this Legislature but I am sent here by a group of people to represent to the best of my ability, I want to have the flexibility to do that without resorting to stratagem. So let's leave the rule the way that it is and reject this offered amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of rule 14. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.
