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I think reconsideration is an extraordinary measure, one which should require more than a majority vote in the membership and if we allow this to occur, we are simply going to be reconsidering bills that have died many, many times. If a bill is not strong enough to receive more than 25 votes on Final Reading, then it is probably not the kind of measure that should pass anyway. One of the most significant problems that the State of Nebraska faces is the fact that it is too easy to pass legislation in this process and we pass a greater percentage of bills I think than is probably appropriate and we shouldn't be taking steps to make it easier for bills that have problems with them and bills that do not have strong support to be enacted, and so I certainly very strongly oppose Senator DeCamp's rule change.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator DeCamp, you may close on your amendment...or rule change.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, Mr. President, for all my friends who see plots everywhere or are sure this is a multibank deal, the multibank thing falls under other rules, three days rules and so on and so forth. You would have to have 30 votes on that anyway. I mean even a dumb feller, Senator Wesely, could figure that out. But since you see sinister plots, I will withdraw the thing and wait for the first one of you to come begging me to help you get 30 votes because your bill failed on Final and the last one I remember was your cotton-pickin' school district by election in Lincoln, as I recall, that you were begging like a baby, but I will let you see what it is like to try to raise 30 votes when you had 25 in the first place and you didn't happen to have Senator Marsh here or somebody else because they had to be at some important meeting, and it happens, and we will see where you get the other 5.

PRESIDENT: So you are withdrawing the motion...the change. All right, withdrawn. The matter is withdrawn. Any further rule changes?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next proposed rules change I have is offered by Senator Lamb.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the amendment I have is to Rule 2, Section 1, and a copy of that is on your desks and it merely states that we will adopt rules only every other year. It seems to me it is logical that since we organize every two years, we assign
