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two that weren't caused by deaths. Now I think that has to be done. But I guess I would hate to see a lot of switching going on during the two year period for one reason that hasn't been mentioned this morning. We print material and send it out to our constituents stating who serves on each committee and it seems to be coming more apparent to me all the time that those people that are lobbying us out in our areas or contacting us, do it sometimes because we are on a certain committee, and that is the mail that we get. So I guess I would hate to see us change regularly as we go through the two year period. Now this year we have had a lot of changes and I don't know whether we have any material printed that states all those changes or not to our constituents. But in a normal year the years that I have been down here we haven't had that many changes and those printed booklets and things that we put out are pretty accurate for the two year period. But we might as well quit printing them if we are going to switch every time we don't like what is going on in our committee. So I guess that is something that hasn't been mentioned. I think from a constituent standpoint they would rather we didn't do this switching. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, Senators, you have just heard one of our Senators say, life is too short not to get to serve on a committee that you would like to. I am going to tell you a story of what happened to Senator Marge Higgins when she was elected in 1980. I came down here, was sworn in, and the Committee on Committees met. Now one of the Senators involved in this controversy this morning came to me before we caucused in Omaha and begged me, pleaded, please, Marge, give me a vote for Committee on Committees, and I did. And then when the Committee on Committees met, Senator Marge Higgins had put in to serve on Public Works Committee. That Senator who had begged me to vote for him for Committee on Committees, kept that Committee on Committees for hours fighting because Senator Labeledz said, Senator Higgins has put in for Public Works Committee and we were elected to represent the senators from the second district. But this other senator said, I made a deal with Senator so and so from another district, I promised him Public Works. So for hours they argued, did Higgins want Public Works or Public Health. Since I was out celebrating with Senator Labeledz's family and my family our election, they called around until they finally found me and I talked to this senator's legislative aide and I said I have already said that I want to be on Public Works,
