whatever Senator Labedz keeps telling you is right. So the fight went on and another senator who got up this morning to oppose Senator Fenger and this motion, he said, Well, by golly, I'll take Public Works. What do you think of that?" And Senator Labedz said, "Well, Senator So-and-So, you have seniority over Senator Higgins so you can have it but you can't trade a Second District vote to a senator in another district. You can't make a deal like that." Well some senators do and I'm only sorry that I'm so stupid. This is the second time this guy has done this to me. So what I would like to ask you is this. When we vote for somebody for Committee on Committees, are they morally obliged or are they obliged by our rules not to do vote trading behind your back and make deals with senators from other districts? Are they obliged to represent the senators that gave them the vote that they begged and pleaded for? I agree with Senator Newell. Life is too short not to get the chance to serve on the committees you want to. I also think it is too short not to get the chance to be serving on the committee that you were actually entitled to serve on. Thank you, Senators.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if you read the Journal you'll notice that I opposed this in the committee. When I came down here I was put on a committee that I hated. I really did hate and I have never really hated in my life. I've become angry but I hated this committee and I went to the proper powers and I begged and pleaded and offered half votes. I did everything I could to try to get off this committee and I was told no. No way can you change committees unless there is a vacancy due to somebody passing away or somebody leaving the Legislature. The committees are set and that is it. So I wouldn't even go to committee meetings and then I knew this was a bad thing to do because I was on the committee and I had responsibilities but it really bugged me and I couldn't take it so I didn't go to some of them, quite a few of them, but it didn't do any good to go to the powers to be to ask to change because they said the rules are the rules. This is the way it is done and that is it. I have nothing against Senator Vard Johnson or Senator Newell. They are real fine people. I like them both but the issue here, changing the rules in the middle of the stream, starting opening up Pandora's box and I don't care what happened back in 1977 or '76 or '75. I just care what's happened since I've been here and what the new modern version is. The new modern version is unless somebody passes away or leaves the Legislature you don't change committees so I'm going to support Senator Fenger. Thank you.
