

but ultimately it is our joint decision. I do not wish to see LB 378 indefinitely postponed. I think there is a very valid reason relating to needing to get this moving at this stage of the Legislature, not in the final days that we meet. I would urge you to vote red on the kill motion and then accept the proposed amendment so that LB 378 may be moved.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise as much to try to find out where we are as anything. We are on the kill motion. Do you have any amendments after that so I can...?

SENATOR CLARK: We have twenty-five amendments from Senator Wesely. We have one from Senator Cullan. I am sure that we probably could not finish it by noon.

SENATOR DeCAMP: So we are talking twenty-six amendments, is that right?

SENATOR CLARK: Twenty-six amendments.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Senator Wesely, can I ask you a question.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Senator Wesely, obviously, if you have twenty-six or twenty-five amendments, you have more than a passing interest in the legislation apparently. Are you intending to take each of these up individually and are they substantive amendments or I guess I am asking to kind of lay out your plans?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes, each amendment has been carefully drawn, each deals with a specific issue to point out the need to send the bill back to committee so each should be considered separately and debated. My intent is to take as long as possible debating this issue to try and point out the need for more careful consideration and not to allow a bill to be rammed through this Legislature just because a lobby is so strongly behind it.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes, okay. Mr. President, may I be excused for lunch?
