

over the bill, number three, at this time I would ask that we immediately go to work on the bill, take the amendments as they come up and treat them with the same amount of consideration and courtesy and attention that they deserve. But I am absolutely and I ask you, if you pass over this bill you are not doing the responsible thing because we can attempt to do that with two, three, four hundred other bills and the last, the fifty-ninth, the sixtieth day will come by and nothing will have been accomplished.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol. Now this is speaking to the point of the division, the motion to divide.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, in a meeting of the committee chairmen this morning it was discussed as to what we would do in the next few days to avoid a situation like we're getting in on this bill and we were in the other day on the "CON" bill, certificate of need, and what is happening is that if we must have the hearing in this body then we're going to have two bills probably this session, this one and the certificate of need. Now, Senator Schmit, as much as you may not like to do it, if we are going to take all of these amendments which Senator Beutler certainly has a right to do one at a time, we can bog down with this one just like we are with the certificate of need. I don't think it is necessary. I think there are other bills that are just as necessary this year and certainly are important to some other members of the Legislature. So I would urge you to attempt at least to get together on some of these amendments, some of these problems that those of you who are intensely interested in this bill could look at and perhaps in an hour or two of your time save considerable time on this floor. So I would really urge you to do this and Senator Beutler or anyone else has the right to look into these individual portions of the bill as prescribed by our rules. But I would urge the committee or those members of the body who are interested in this to have a look and fight these things out other than on this floor but if you want to take the rest of this session on two bills, it's alright I guess.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers, did you wish to speak to the motion of division?

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President, members, I rise to support Senator Beutler's motion to divide the question by the sections as he indicated. This bill, as Senator Schmit pointed out, has gone through quite a stormy history in the past but to suggest that this bill has worked out any agreements out here on the floor is, of course, not true and I
