don't think that anybody in this body understands that any more than Senator Schmit, Senator Beutler and myself and Senator Krener do. We know there are some differences in philosophy. We know that there are some problems as each of us view this bill from the way that we anticipate that it is going to affect the people of the State of Nebraska. Now I suggest that this is an important enough bill and an important enough issue that if the introducers do not want to sit down and discuss it privately, then I think we should discuss it en masse out here on the floor section by section. To indicate that this bill is not going to affect the people of this state in any type of situation except a large situation in the future is of course wrong. This is an important piece of legislation dealing with an important natural resource and if it takes two weeks to discuss it out here then sobeit. I am willing to do it and I'm not going to sit here and let this slide across simply to be a good guy and try to get to somebody else's bills of the eight hundred or whatever it is we've got ahead of us. This piece of legislation, if its going to pass or if we are going to deal with it, I think we need to deal with it and dissect it if necessary and deal with it in as good a fashion as we possibly can whether we get to any of the others or not because I happen to think this is an important enough issue to spend that time on. So I would urge the adoption of Senator Beutler's suggestion to divide the question and really look at this issue section by section.
