SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion before the House has been presented by Senator Lamb. All those in favor of the Exec Board report vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Lamb, you have two more reports to make, I think. Do you want to discuss those? The Clerk will record and then I will recognize Senator Lamb.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on approval of the Kearney State College resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The first motion is carried. Now the Chair recognizes Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, the second one is from Chadron State College and the Kline Campus Center, they have a problem up there and they would like to spend \$19,000 for mud jacks. I move that this resolution be adopted.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: A question of Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, sir.

SENATOR FOWLER: Senator Lamb, do you think it is fiscally prudent to be investing money in Chadron State College at this time as Senator Cullan is working with a committee to review perhaps moving that to another state? Perhaps now is not the time to be investing dollars in an institution that may not be with us for long?

SENATOR LAMB: I am surprised to hear you say that, Senator Fowler, because in my experience in this body you have been the first to spend money for education no matter where.

SENATOR FOWLER: Not in Wyoming though is the problem.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I would just ask Senator Lamb, what did you say this was for, mud jacks? Could you tell me what those are?

SENATOR LAMB: Well, Senator Nichol, I am not sure I can explain it in much detail but I think you know that the Campus Center up at Chadron State College has had problems in settling. In fact I was up there last summer and it is a real mess. I think they are trying to salvage half of the building, that is my understanding, and this is some sort of a jacking device to help in that restoration effort.
