bill that says that. We ought to have a repealer for the sections that Senator Cullan is trying to amend...

SENATOR CLARK: You have one minute left.

SENATOR NEWELL: ...breause that appealer, that appealer is what we are doing if we do not adopt this amendment. We are keeping a skeleton of a bill and the reason we are keeping that skeleton is only because we are required to have it. If you want Certificate of Need to do anything, this amendment must be adopted. If it is your intention to destroy Certificate of Need, then you must vote no. I urge this body to do what is right. We can do away with the mickey mouse but protect the process so that it can have some little long term impact. We need to make this change at the very least. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Newell amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. While we are waiting for the vote, I would like to announce there is five seventh and eighth graders from Park Avenue Christian School at Norfolk, Nebraska. They are guests of Senator Richard Peterson. Marvin Hess is the pastor. They are in the North balcony. Will you stand and be recognized please? Welcome to the Legislature. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: I would like to have a roll call.

SENATOR CLARK: A roll call has been requested.

SENATOR NEWELL: And a record vote if I could.

SENATOR CLARK: It will be a record vote if it is a roll call. The Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 921 and 922, Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is offered by Senator Newell.

SENATOR CLARK: The Call is raised. Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: I would like to lay that over, put that on the bottom because of my high degree of frustration at the moment, I don't want to take it up.
