Wisconsin. He, too, is leaving the leadership of administration of the Lincoln Public Schools effective in December. I think it is appropriate that this body recognize him for his outstanding leadership because Lincoln Public Schools are recognized again nationally for the quality of education and most of all Mr. Prasch has convinced me that he is a person who is willing to sit down and talk about critical issues of education and when he sees there is a compromise necessary he will make that compromise in the best interest of the students and the best interest of the patrons of the system. So once again, let's give Mr. Prasch acknowledgment of this Legislature for his outstanding leadership for fifteen years in the Lincoln Public Schools.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the resolution. All those in favor vote aye and opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 38 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SENATOR CLARK: The resolution is passed. LR 237.
