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or a youngster who doesn't need the car to go back and forth to work, to impound it. But as you say, yes, Senator Kilgarin, I would consider taking that out if you could pick up two or three votes to help me with my bill.

SENATOR KILGARIN: Okay, well thank you, Senator Haberman. That is really all the questions that I have on your proposal. I guess there are some provisions of Senator Haberman's amendment that I agree with and there are some that I don't agree with. I suppose....

SENATOR CLARK: You have one minute left.

SENATOR KILGARIN: Thank you, Bob. I suppose at this point in time I would not be able to support Senator Haberman's amendment. I think maybe we need to sit down with all the interested parties and talk some more and work on a compromise because I think that there are good points both to be found in the Judiciary Committee amendment and Senator Haberman's amendment.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Kilgarin...she has a half a minute left, I tried to get the other parties to sit down and join this into one bill. Nobody seemed to be interested, Senator Kilgarin.

SENATOR KILGARIN: Well, thank you, Senator Haberman. I would suggest that at this point in time anyhow that you reject Senator Haberman's amendment to the committee amendment and I feel rather remiss in having to say that, but at this point I think that is the direction we should take, work with the Judiciary Committee amendments and hopefully before Select File we can get the interested parties to sit down and work this out. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Stoney. Senator Nichol. We are on the Haberman amendment, and then we have Senator Marsh and Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I could pick at Senator Haberman and Senator Hoagland's bill for quite some time but I think you have probably heard enough. I just wanted to say one or two things. First of all, my office is across the hall from Senator Haberman's. It is not that difficult to get to. My staff has been available since a long time ago, long before the beginning of the session. Senator Haberman knew we had his bill. Senator Haberman knew what the decision of the Judiciary Committee was. We are there all of the time. The other people that were interested in the bills felt free to
