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the maximum fine from \$1000 to \$500 which I am willing to do. Senator Marsh stands up and says she cannot support this because it takes the work permit, driver's permit. Senator Marsh, it just does this on somebody who is caught driving on a suspended license. We impound the car then because as it is now if we take somebody's license, we don't know whether they are driving with a suspended license or not. But if we catch them driving with a suspended license, then and only then do we impound the automobile. And I would think, Senator Marsh, that you would be on the front row up here helping me with this bill because you want to save children's lives, this will help save children's lives, and adult's lives. So instead of fighting my bill, I would like to ask you to vote for my amendment so that we can save lives as half of the accidents and deaths are caused by alcohol. Senator Sieck, I, too, have had technicians working on this for seven months and have input from everybody. Here are the people who gave input to me on my bill: Fred Zwonechek, Office of Highway Safety; Mothers Against Drunk Drivers, county sheriffs, state patrol....

SENATOR CLARK: You have one minute left, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: ....Colonel Kohmetscher, judges, Highway Commission, the Nebraska Department on Alcoholism and Drugs. I have had plenty of technician input. I give the rest of my time to Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Hoagland. You have about 50 seconds.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I wonder, Senator Clark, if I might have two minutes just to....

SENATOR CLARK: No.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: If I could have unanimous consent to....

SENATOR CLARK: No, if he would have wanted you to have two minutes, he would have given you two minutes.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, then I have nothing to say, Senator Clark, I can't say it in in 15 seconds, so, thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: You have got about 30 seconds.

SENATOR HABERMAN: You told me I had a minute and I wanted to give it to him.
