

done. So with that said, I would urge adoption of the committee amendments and the amendment to the amendment that my good friend Senator Koch is going to offer.

SENATOR CLARK: We have an amendment to the committee amendments.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch would move to amend the committee amendments and that amendment is found on page 1052 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. My amendment does two things, it strikes the technical community colleges and the Educational Service Units. I don't believe it is appropriate to place them in here. We discussed this issue earlier this session, did not see fit to do it then, and primarily I can support the bill if this amendment to the committee amendment is adopted. I ask for the adoption of the amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Howard Peterson, your light is still on. I guess he is not in the Chamber. Senator Kahle.

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. President and members, I don't want to take up time but I wonder if I could ask Senator Koch a question. If I understand correctly and from people that I have been hearing from, the demand much outruns the ability to provide the funding for these projects. Can you give us any enlightenment on that, that there is a lot more demand for winterization than there is money available or maybe Senator DeCamp could answer that?

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Senator Kahle. As I told you on the last issue, the first cycle the number of applications was considerable and they were able to grant a certain few. The second cycle which we are in right now the applications are even greater than they were before and we have about \$5 million that they are trying to obtain on this first go around. So we have two more cycles and so it obviously means that there are great numbers of schools out there who have finally found out this is available and are making applications. So it would also take in major grants and minor grants, which I have no opposition to extend the sunset until '86 but I think the public schools should have first call on this to find out whether or not we can handle it there.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, with that answer I support the amendment to the amendment.
