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dollars could be well spent, but the other dollars are also needed in our state, and I would hesitate to set up something I know which will be vetoed.

SENATOR KAHLE: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I certainly concur with Senator Newell that the need is legitimate. I also concur that I think Senator Newell is being a little chintzy by just adding \$850,000. I think he should have gone ahead and shot for the whole \$4 million. I am not so sure, however, in an area of priorities that this is any more chintzy than allowing the counties to pay for their audits, cutting increases in for the mental retardation regions, keeping state employees to 3.75 percent salary increase, curtailing an increase in DPI's food allocation for a Veterans Home and some other institutions, and still...and still under the aura of a 4 cent cigarette tax increase and a 2 percent increase in the individual income tax rate, and I think right now a 30 percent increase in the corporate tax rate, I agree that it is a meager request, \$850,000, but when you look at it as a part of the whole, it isn't so meager. When you look at some of the other cuts we have made, some of the other cuts this body has sustained today, I think that as worthwhile, as meritorious as the request is, when there is no money, there is no alternative. We can't spend what we don't have.

SENATOR KAHLE: Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, it is comforting to know that we have an ally such as Senator Newell for this project that Senator Cope and I have been...and others have been working on for some time. We are grateful for that support, but it is like Senator Dworak just pointed out, that we feel that we cannot ask for more money at this time. Everything that Senator Newell says is correct. We need to constantly fix more roofs and do other repair work and we have come a long ways in this building itself. You will notice that we have done a considerable amount of work and we are pretty pleased about that. But we thought this year we would have to hold off quite a little spending because we know that we don't have it.
