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But I would like the body to think about this. The Appropriations Committee to a person agreed that 309 was probably one of the most worthwhile bills that has ever been passed, but we agreed also that we didn't have the money to do it and think about that when you are being critical of other projects that you like especially. When we cut those, we did it with a lot of thought, believe me, everyone of them, because we cut the ones that we liked particularly too. So I would have to ask you not to vote for this amendment.

SENATOR KAHLE: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, may I have a question of Senator Burrows, please?

SENATOR KAHLE: Senator Burrows, do you yield?

SENATOR BURROWS: Certainly.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Burrows, you alluded to the reasons that this was being cut out was that it is an election year and we shouldn't do these things in an election year. Is that correct?

SENATOR BURROWS: That is correct. The information I hear from this body....

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, that is now, Senator Burrows.....

SENATOR BURROWS:is that it is.....

SENATOR KAHLE: One at a time, please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you Senator Burrows. Now, Senator Burrows, if you should happen to return to the Legislature next year and it not be an election year, would you support cutting these maintenance things out of the budget?

SENATOR KAHLE: You have a question, Senator Burrows. Senator Burrows, would you care to answer?

SENATOR BURROWS: If I get more than two words, I would certainly like to answer.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, you can either answer....

SENATOR BURROWS: I will not be back in the Legislature next year, Senator Haberman. I think you know this is the
