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divide myself and produce more of my kind in as quick a time....

PRESIDENT: Half a minute, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:as microbes can do. So the difference between the plant and the animal is that the animal possesses the matter, possesses life but also can move, but animal cannot think. So when I get a chance to speak again I will take you to the next step of development and when we get to the human being we will branch off from that into a discussion of what human beings are to be about which includes an appreciation of those things that have been produced by other human beings in the past. That should be there not only for appreciation but to guide us in our conduct for the future so that we can have those evolving standards of decency that go along with a maturing society, and as a matter of fact that is why certain things which were allowed as constitutional no longer are.

PRESIDENT: Before we go to the next speaker, the Chair takes privilege in introducing 235 Seniors from Burke High in Omaha from Senators Stoney, Hoagland and Kilgarin's Districts. They are up here in the north and the south balconies with teachers Dave Haar and Roger Gehrig. We don't want everybody to stand up at the same time, the balconies might come down, so we will just say, hello and greetings to Burke High Seniors and welcome to your Unicameral Legislature. The Chair recognizes Senator Howard Peterson.

SENATOR H. PETERSON: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I wonder if Senator Wesely would yield to a question. I guess Senator Wesely isn't here....

SENATOR WESELY: I am here, Howard, I'm sorry.

SENATOR H. PETERSON: Where are you?

SENATOR WESELY: I just got back, I'm sorry.

SENATOR H. PETERSON: I noticed in this morning's Journal or Star on page 12 an article on the Peter Kiewitt Foundation which indicated their applications last year decreased tremendously and for all practical purposes as I read the article they are begging for applications for the use of their funds and I wonder if the University Foundation or if the people at Morrill Hall have in any manner applied to Peter Kiewitt or to the Lincoln Foundation
