final remark and I made it just the other day on the floor. The state has a cash flow problem and I have agreed with the Governor and his office that we will change our method of paying schools their state aid to help the state with the cash flow problem in October. I think that is quite a concession. So I am asking here for this body to make a concession to provide them with the monies to carry on the special education programs which they must meet under our law and our rules and regulations. They have not been changed.

SENATOR CLARK: Your time is up.

SENATOR KOCH: They are entitled to 90 percent of excess costs and we made that statement and now we are going to give them 75 percent of the excess cost. Isn't that a nice commitment from this body? It checks our integrity.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Koch amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Koch, do you want a record vote?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, I request a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of a Call of the House will vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All legislators will return to their seats and please check in. So far we have more checked out than checking in. Now we reversed that. Senator Newell, Senator Wesely, Senator Haberman. We are looking for Senator Wesely and Senator Newell. Senator Haberman, we may or may not be able to find, I don't know. We found him hiding up here. Thank you, Senator Haberman. Senator Koch, did you want a roll call vote? The Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 1402 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CLARK: The Clerk cannot hear up here.
