CLERK: Senator Clark voting yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, I ask for or request a Call of the House and a roll call vote. We have got too much business to do to get out of here this early.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 3 mays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. I've only had about fifteen or twenty senators ask me what time we can get out of here and I don't care because I have nothing to do but a lot of them want to go home so whatever you want to do is fine with me. If everyone will look up here and push their green light please. Thank you. That is very rewarding. Senator Duda, Senator Beyer. There is seven excused already. Senator Schmit, would you record in, please. Senator Warner. The Clerk will call the roll. What we are voting on is adjournment. If you want to adjourn vote aye, if you don't want to vote no.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1409 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 14 mays on the motion to adjourn, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: We are adjourned until nine-thirty, Monday morning.
