SENATOR NICHOL: We are considering the Richard Peterson amendment. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay. Oh, excuse me, a roll call vote. Senator Peterson, did you want to go under Call?

SENATOR R. PETERSON: A Call of the House and a roll call vote, and a record vote on it.

SENATOR NICHOL: The question is, shall we go under Call. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed may.

CLERK: Senator Nichol voting yes.

SENATOR NICHOL: Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, to go under Call.

SENATOR NICHOL: The body is under Call. Will all of you please take your seats. Sergeant at Arms, will you please locate those who are not here and signify by checking in when you come in, please. Senator Pirsch, will you check in please. Two are excused, Senator Clark and Senator Marvel. Senator Haberman, would you check in, please. Thank you. We're looking for Senator Kilgarin and Senator Lamb. Begin the roll call, please.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1572 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 32 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: The amendment is not adopted. Senator Peterson.

SENATOR R. PETERSON: Mr. Speaker, I would request withdrawal of the other two amendments. My people have talked to me and expressed their views and I tried and I can see where I stand and that is all I can ask and I thank you and I request to withdraw the other two amendments.

SENATOR NICHOL: Any objections? The other two amendments are withdrawn. Senator VonMinden, would you step to your microphone, please. Would you recess us until one-thirty this afternoon.
