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being an employer, so to try to discuss human problems that are very complex in a vacuum as though you are talking about robots, I think is ridiculous and does not touch the issue at all as it should be addressed. Instead of standing up here talking about all these other things, and I won't go through all of them because I touched on some of them, we ought to deal with what it is we think the employees are entitled to. If we think they are entitled to not very much, we should just say so. But we shouldn't pretend to have a regard for those who work, then turn around and say, but we shouldn't pay them. This session and in other sessions I have seen great solicitude shown toward the small loan companies, the ones I call the loan sharks. They have got to be allowed to make it. You have got to jack that interest up. They have to get this.

SENATOR CLARK: You have one minute left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The farmers are saying, the government has got to give us more direct payment. We have got to be insured of this return on our labor. Give it to us. But then we, who have it within our power to set an example of how things should be done, do not want to give a fair raise to those who work for us. I don't think that is fair and I don't think it is right. So if we forget everything else and talk about equity and what is proper, we should give this increase that is reasonable. Some of the increases I don't think are reasonable. They are too small but I certainly don't think what Senator Fenger is offering should be accepted by us today.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, there is an old song that they had a couple years ago that goes something like this. "You've got to know when to hold them and you've got to know when to fold them". Now you have already made decisions on these issues. You made them repeatedly. You may not have been aware when you were doing it but you were making these decisions one after another. You made them all during this session and you made them in the special session. That is right. You made them when you decided on amounts of dollars. You made them when you decided on the rules and delegated the authority and direction to the Appropriations Committee. You made them when the Governor made certain indications, certain budget filings. Now I am not going to be able to rewrite the budget nor is any individual in here which is what we are attempting one after another. You are not going to be able to do her. There are not 25 votes for this, I guarantee it. I don't claim
