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has expressed the desire to have this level of funding, is that the \$187,073 that he mentioned ought to come out of the 816 money. So the motion when we get to 816 it ought to be \$2,187,073 instead of taking that money out of...at this point out of state funds. Now I am frankly trying to save whatever I can for state operations. And you have also decided you want \$70million in aid. You have got \$70 million now. As things stand, you end up with \$70,187,073. I don't think, you know, if you want to argue that we are not going to nip local government neither should we nip state government, I guess, if that is the.....

SENATOR NEWELL: Let me ask you another question, Senator Warner. Then is it your...if your motion to ~~move~~ \$187,000 around is successful, then that is your...will that be your last attempt to borrow from aid to local governments?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Newell, I suspect by Monday that I may have all kinds of amendments that will cut all kinds of things.

SENATOR NEWELL: Thank you, Senator Warner. I rise to oppose the Warner amendment. I rise to oppose the Warner amendment because, frankly, I think that the game has been the state is in trouble, there is no question about that and I am very sorry and very sympathetic. I wish the economy was better. I wish a whole lot of things were better but they are not. But to take away from local governments is a mistake. Local governments have the same problems that the state government has and the effects of the new Reagan-omics are going to be as difficult for them as they are for us. With that in mind, I hope this Legislature is as considerate of local governments as we are about our own problems. I urge your opposition to the reconsideration motion.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman and members of the body, I understand Senator Warner's concern and I sympathize with those concerns. They are appropriate since he and the committee have worked long hours trying to put together some kind of budget that the state might be able to move through this next year with. At the same token, those of us, and we all come from various communities and the community colleges do carry on a role and mission that we have placed before them. Therefore, I think that the body just committed themselves a moment ago by 27 votes and
