sources. There is no other source of funds. But with the private sector there is another source of funds and that is what the federalism is all about and they are going to look at another source of funds, and that is why this correction was made because a central agency then would have to disburse these funds. I realize that in the coming year there will be not a great amount of activity in either source because of lack of funds. There are a lot of people out there waiting for services and we will not be able to service them with the appropriation that is facing us at the present time. But we do want to continue the existing services and that is what this is all about. So I urge you to support this amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Hefner, did you wish to close on this?

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, I would just move for the adoption of the amendment as presented to the body.

SENATOR NICHOL: The question before us is the amendment by Senators Hefner, Sieck, Marsh and Fowler. All those in favor signify by voting aye, opposed nay.

CLERK: Senator Nichol voting yes.

SENATOR NICHOL: Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, do you have another one to go on?

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senator Remmers that is found on page $15\,46$.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Remmers.

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I hate to bring forth another amendment. I have not a very big item and I had presented it to Senator Warner before and he forgot to put it in the Appropriation bill, into this bill. I will just briefly give you my problem. The Southeast Nebraska Land and Cattle Company has an abandoned test well on their property in Richardson County. The well is discharging salt water into their field. The Nebraska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission has no record of a test well. This indicates the well was drilled well before 1960. The Conservation Commission has no records prior to 1960. It is a duty of the Nebraska Oil
