and I think it is irresponsible.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Sieck.

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President and members of the body. I support this amendment. You are concerned about the court case. I don't feel that we need to be concerned. This thing is settled. The attorneys have been all paid off. They are not going to incur another court case. We just have to finish up what is being done and that is what this \$250,000 is pledged for that the DPI has, it is pledged for that. I have a feeling that it isn't going to be used but some people feel it is going to be used. If it isn't used, it can be used for people that are on the waiting list for the private sector. There is no question in my mind about this. But we should support the regional concept. We should support the areas that are in need and I feel that we are not completely doing that. And this additional money will at least give us a little help. I don't think we should lose on the program. We should continue the program and we have got people out there on the waiting list and we are not going to serve them, I know that. And that is the reason I felt that we need to get together with the private and with the regional this summer so that we can see who can serve what and how we can best serve them and how we can get the money, where the money is going to come from. There is a lot of unanswered questions. That is the reason I support this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I have a couple of questions I would like to have answered and I don't know quite who to ask. Perhaps Senator Warner or Senator Marsh.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Relative to the residency at the Beatrice Home.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Marsh will respond, I guess.

SENATOR CARSTEN: As I understood the original concept, those people that were capable as I understood originally to be moved, could be moved to these regional areas, but there were a number of people under no circumstances would be able to be cared for in the regional area and there was a target number that was expected to be reached at the Beatrice Home. Can you tell me how many are there now, and
