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a lot of the clients out of the Beatrice Developmental Center. I think in years gone by that Region 4 has been shortchanged, and so you would receive...your region would receive your proportionate share of this \$100,000. I think this is a fair compromise and I urge the body to support it.

SENATOR NICHOL: As far as I know Senator Haberman is the only one that has turned his light on to speak on the amendment to the amendment. If that is incorrect, please let me see your hands. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I rise to oppose this. You heard the members of the Appropriations Committee said that it will not increase any funds, it's the shifting of funds. You heard a man who knows more about this than I do say that the issue is settled, that's Senator Sieck. You heard another man get up and want to cut this, Senator Dworak. And I said that there was one region that got a 14.63 percent increase and guess whose district that was, or area that was. Senator Dworak's. And guess who has got the minus point 12 percent? That is mine. So I say, let's defeat the amendment. You heard members of the Appropriations Committee support the amendment. It is the shifting of funds. The Governor hasn't told me is going to veto it, or he doesn't like it. And I don't know whether he has personally contacted Senator Hefner or not. But let's go along with the Marsh amendment, shift the funds and go from there. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: As far as I know there is no one else who wishes to speak to the amendment on the amendment. Oh, Senator Apking, you do?

SENATOR APKING: I just have a point of information. We toured DPI at Beatrice this fall. As I recall the target of numbers down there is right around 350 as per the law suit and at that time they were talking about moving out 40 this year. That is so you will know what they are looking at in moving out. I don't want to make any judgment one way or another on the amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Dworak, are you going to close on this amendment to the amendment? Or Senator Hefner. Senator Burrows, did you want to speak to the amendment on the amendment?

SENATOR BURROWS: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I would certainly support this amendment. It moves the figure down from nearly \$400,000 to \$100,000 that is specified, and would
