CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR NICHOL: We are under Call. Please return to your seats. Sergeant at Arms, please round up those that are absent and sign in, please. Please record your presence. The ones that I have excused are Apking, DeCamp, Cullan, Marvel, Schmit, VonMinden, Marsh and Cal Carsten. We are short three. Let's proceed with the call, Mr. Clerk. Proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 1598 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 21 nays to adjourn, Mr. President.
