SENATOR LAMB: In view of the fact that there are five more amendments and there are 14 people excused, I move that we adjourn until 9:30 Monday morning, April 5th.

SENATOR NICHOL: All those in favor signify by saying aye. Opposed. Machine vote.

CLERK: Senator Nichol voting no.

SENATOR NICHOL: Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, to adjourn.

SENATOR NICHOL: We are still in business. The next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, the amendment that I am offering is one that will cause us to lose some funds for ourselves, the Legislature. What it does is delete \$495,000 for renovation of legislative space, the new hearing rooms. Now it is my contention that in the tight budgetary situation that we find ourselves in, that it would look rather bad to our constituents or to the people of the State of Nebraska to see services being perhaps cut, social services and other things that they expect from government and then come in and see large renovation projects and pretty plush surroundings being put in in our own spaces.
