government is based on the symbols that they see. If they look at the activities on the floor of the Legislature a lot of times, they would want to throw their hands up and just go home and do whatever people do when they feel everything is hopeless. But they might look at the building itself and say, that building is going to last a lot longer than the people who happen to be in the Legislature or any other office at this time, and for the sake of the building we will go along with the state for a little while longer. The point I am trying to get across, Senator Vickers, is this, if the body has one part which is ill, that ill part may not kill the body but it could infect it to such an extent that there could be an impact on the rest of it. So we ought to try to do everything we can to upgrade this building. It is regrettable that we have let the Governor, the President and others put us in a frame of mind where we think we have got to travel cheap on every single thing. Now I work in a barbershop and you can estimate how old I probably am by my wisdom, you know, to achieve the amount of wisdom I have it would take at least a certain number of years from birth to where I am and that would probably make you feel I am about 350 years old, but I am not. But let's say that I may be. I was in a barbershop at which I did not work and there were two barbers discussing what the price of haircuts ought to be. There was one real old gentleman who cut hair primarily to while away the hours and he could while away a lot of hours on one person's head. So he felt that haircuts ought to be 35 cents. A younger barber felt that they ought to be \$2.00. So they had a long argument back and forth and finally the young barber said, well, I guess each man knows what his work is worth. So maybe what we are telling the public when we travel cheap all the time is that we know what we are worth or what we are not worth. The attitude that people adopt toward you is determined largely by the attitude you adopt towards yourself. If you show yourself to be one with self-respect and a high personal regard, other people will tend to accord you that kind of respect. On the other hand, if you are a grinner, you grin when nothing is funny; you scratch when you don't itch, then people see you as a clown and that is the way that they treat you. So we put a lot of things in front of us that will be filtered through people's minds and they will use that as a basis for determining how to make an ultimate judgment of us and our value. So I, for one, think that the Legislature should travel first class. The Legislature is a concept. It is an idea. It is a symbol and maybe the symbol is more imaginary than real. But if you don't have a high goal, you will not reach very far. Most people will not achieve what they
