CLERK: Senator Lamb voting no.

SENATOR LAMB: Have you all voted? Record. Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: It is probably a very beneficial thing to find out who is all here and who is all. . . who would like to have an opportunity to vote on these important issues. So, I would like to have a Call of the House.

SENATOR LAMB: A Call of the House has been requested. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR LAMB: The House is under Call. All Senators return to your seats and record your presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Senator Schmit, Senator Lowell Johnson, Senator Wiitala, Senator DeCamp, Senator Higgins. Please begin the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 17 ayes, 27 nays, 2 present and not voting, and 3 excused and not voting. Vote appears on page 1649 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR LAMB: Motion fails. Senator Labeledz on the Nichol-Haberman-Hoagland amendment. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I know that we have been here a long time and people may find it difficult to concentrate on what we are talking about, but you should realize that in order to accomplish certain things with reference to the drunk driving problem changes are being made in the substance of other statutes in the criminal code that would impact on all offenses. If you look on page 993, I believe that is part of Senator Nichol's amendment, Senator Nichol is this material in 993 and 994 part of the amendment that we are considering now? Oh, anyway it says that the period of probation that can be imposed for a first offense can be. . . five years for a second or a subsequent offense if the offense is less than a felony. Which means that the probation for a misdemeanor can wind up being longer than the probation for a felony. This is what happens when you begin to develop a tunnel or a narrow vision.
