SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought that you were dozing up there and I would get a little extra time because I'm trying to develop a point. If there is an overflow nobody here seems to be really concerned about that. But the ones who have to maintain these jails certainly are going to be concerned. If somebody is sent to the sheriff, he cannot of his own volition let them go. I think you ought to consider these things and you probably ought to defeat this amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: (No response).

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: (No response).

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Hoagland. That will not be necessary, Senator, you are the last one on the list. So, the motion is to...oh, Senator Nichol, to close on the Nichol-Hoagland-Haberman amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman, we have wandered a long way from the original amendment that we had and it simply makes two provisions. The first is that it makes jail time a part of probation. The second part of the amendment simply provides statutory authority for all of the courts to do this. That's all this amendment does. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the Nichol-Haberman-Hoagland amendment. Those in support vote yes, those opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting yes.

SENATOR LAMB: Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 9 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Nichol-Haberman-Hoagland amendment.

SENATOR LAMB: Motion is adopted. The amendment is adopted. Hext amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Haberman-Hoagland-Nichol would move to amend the bill and that is on page 1354 as well.

SENATOR LAME: Senator Nichol.
