They forget, they don't do it, they don't pick up drunk drivers license, this is not a dependable place to keep a record. Secondly, it was pointed out a little while ago there is no charge, there is no guilty plea, there is no finding of a drunk driving charge. There is no record to keep. So, I submit to you, support this amendment. Do away with this big loophole and have a drunk driving bill that means something. Sure, we have adequate laws now, but we are not doing it. So what we are attempting to do is say to the judges do this and we mean it.
