anyway we want too, and I guess if we got a Mickey Mouse or a coward we can. But if we have got somebody who will stand up it doesn't work quite that way. So, what are you going to do? You going to take a bill which some of you may have a genuine interest in and run the risk of it being talked to death by me? Or, are you going to suspend the rules and move it right on across. If you suspend the rule I'll accept my thanks from Senator Hoagland and Senator Haberman just as we leave the Chamber.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Well we are getting down to the bewitching hour I guess, the crazy part of the session. I personally don't have anything else to do tonight anyway. The evening is pretty well shot. As far as I am concerned we might as well stay here and finish this issue. I went down to look at some of the amendments that are pending and they don't seem that awful bad to me. I'm not sure that LB 568 is in the type or the form that I want to pass it on Final Reading. I would suggest to this body if you choose to go ahead and amend the rules and vote this bill up right now, what is going to happen is on Final Reading there is going to be a number of motions to return for specific amendments. The discussion is still going to take place. We are going to have debate on those motions some morning when we are supposed to have Final Reading. So I would just suggest to the body that we might as well go ahead at 9:26 on Monday evening, April 5th and can continue to debate if it takes till midnight we might as well kill this bull while we have it here in front of us. Or deal with this issue and not suspend the rules and wait and try to deal with it some other time.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body I rise to oppose the motion to suspend the rules. I appreciate Senator Hoagland's feeling that he is being harassed but, I just went up to look at those amendments and in most cases if not in the majority of the cases they are serious amendments. People would like to have them considered. In some cases they make some sense. Now I have one of those up there myself so I'm not saying this without some regard to my own personal consideration. But I think if we look at the amendments that are being offered they do deserve an opportunity in the most part to be discussed. With that in mind I would urge the body not to suspend the rules.
