it. I have done all that I can to call your attention to it and try to correct it. I am asking that you adopt the amendment which would strike the provision that says "you will lose your drivers license forever". It would be better to put a steel collar around the persons neck and tell them they will be prohibited from drinking forever. If they drink again and get caught, then you tighten the collar so much that they can't swallow a drop.

SENATOR LAMB: The motion is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. Those in support vote yes. Those opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Lamb voting no.

SENATOR LAMB: Have you all voted? A record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: Senator Dworak requesting a record vote. 15 ayes, 21 nays, 4 present and not voting, and 9 excused and not voting. Vote appears on page 1665 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR LAMB: Motion fails. Next amendment please.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is offered by Senator Newell.

SENATOR LAMB: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, members of the body, this is an amendment that deals with pretrial diversion plus it also has the provisions that require reporting, requires the county attorneys to report those who have attended the pretrial, successfully completed the pretrial diversion program to the Department of Motor Vehicles and that to be disseminated. The proposal is necessitated by the fact that the first attempt to require the reporting law was opposed and unsuccessfully not put into the bill and consequently the sponsors of the amendment to take out the provisions were able to argue later that there was no legitimate way to deal with the issue involved in reporting. Now this provision incorporates both the reporting provisions and the question of the pretrial diversion. Frankly we have talked about pretrial diversion on a number of occasions. We originally placed the pretrial diversion amendment in the bill and the provisions of that were made to try to deal with those people who have a drinking problem. Now the estimates is that 60% of those people who are
